'Three may keep a secret if two of them are dead' How the well advised international family balances transparency, privacy and openness to transfer their wealth successfully.

Secrecy used to be a means of ensuring security. It seems that now the opposite is true yet many clients do not appreciate this development – something that becomes all too clear following a death. 
